Description of Non-conformance and Related Evidence:	
The organisation uses mass balances for material accounting. It was found that the mass balance for SBP controlled material for pellet production does not cover all the volume of feedstock received. However, feedstock received is at least PEFC controlled and all feedstock is listed in the volume overview. SBP controlled biomass produced and sold by the organization with SBP controlled claim is more than the volume needed therefore a positive mass balance is maintained. The company keep records and can justify all volumes of feedstock and biomass.

3.1 Description of the company

Guidance: Please describe the type, structure and operations of the company including its role in the supply chain, its inputs and outputs as they related to SBP Standards.

Industrie du Bois Vielsalm & Cie s.a. (IBV) founded in 1997, is a sawmill and pellets producer situated in Vielsalm on the border between Belgium and Luxembourg. IBV is part of the "Wood and Energy Group International" which produce sawn timber, solid structural timber, wood pellets and renewable energy in the form of electricity and heat at their 3 production sites in Belgium and Germany. The wood comes from the EU and the group can add value to all parts of the trunk by making optimum use of the synergies between material and energy cycles. The site in Vielsalm is the largest in the group. It is here that regional softwoods are processed into sawn timber. The resulting sawmill by-products of sawdust and wood chips are used on-site to produce wood pellets. The site also has a biomass co-generation plant that uses wood residues for which there is no alternative use to produce green electricity and heat. The part of the electricity generated that is not needed internally is fed into the public grid. The heat is used completely in production processes, ensuring the plant has an extremely high level of efficiency. The pelletizing plant has a capacity of 420.000 tons a year and produces 6 mm pellets according to the ENplus A1 and/or SBP standards. IBV is a PEFC certified pellet producer. The IBV pellet factory receive sawdust and chips from the IBV sawmill on-site, from the group sawmills in Germany, and from a few other suppliers of secondary feedstock. Indirectly the wood comes from 200-250 suppliers, mainly sawmills and vertically integrated wood processors. IBV use a mix of primary (low grade logs) and secondary feedstock (wood residues such as sawdust and shavings) and a small fraction of tertiary feedstock (planing chips). Regarding the pellet plant, the relevant part of the sourcing is only the own sawmill residues (SBP-compliant Secondary feedstock). The whole supply chain of the pellet plant is includes around 35 suppliers. The origin is from Belgium and surrounding countries. Norway is not an origin (regarding the RED definition), but primary wood for the sawmill sometimes came from Norway, and the sawmill residues were used by the pellet plant (SBP origin). The wood pellets are sold to clients, but the wood chip production under the SBP scope is used in their own CHP. The wood chips produced to run the CHP are mainly wood residues that cannot be valorised otherwise, ensuring a high level of sustainability and efficiency. For the wood chips around 55% is SBP-controlled Secondary feedstock (biomass) and 44% is SBP-controlled Tertiary feedstock (biomass). Less than 1% is SBP-controlled Primary feedstock. The feedstock for the wood chips production for the CHP has around 13 secondary wood suppliers, 20 tertiary wood suppliers, and around 37 suppliers of primary wood (waste from urban and landscape). The origin is from Belgium and surrounding countries.

5.3 Description of evaluation activities

This surveillance audit was conducted by means of an on-site visit at the IBV facility on 21-04-2026 and 22-04-2026. During the opening meeting, the scope was confirmed. The auditor also explained the methods to be employed during the audit. After the opening meeting, and during the following two days, all relevant requirements of the applicable SBP standard(s) were verified on compliance through the use of the SBP audit portal, Radix tree platform, and checklists.

The audit has been performed by review of documents, data, records and the DTS system, interviews and inspection of the plant. The identified CCP for the process were sourcing and input check, reception and storage, valid sustainability of raw materials, biomass production process, mass balance and volume control, correct claims (including DBSD).

The audit was completed by approving the SBR, SAR, and performing a closing meeting. During this closing meeting, audit results were discussed. This report is the result of the findings of a certification evaluation carried out by an independent lead auditor representing Control Union Certifications. The purpose of the assessment was to evaluate the compliance of the client with respect to the standards used within the scope of the certificate.

5.5 Describe audit sampling methodology used

The sampling of review of records was based on the mass balance system and delivery documents. Random PEFC feedstock shipments of primary, secondary and tertiary materials were checked, as well as pellets shipments and the mass balance records and loading documents (inspection report, and analytical reports) were reviewed. Staff interviews were conducted with the plant manager, sustainability manager, the external SBP consultant, procurement manager, factory and PEFC manager, and material receipt staff. With the square root of the total number of RED-compliant suppliers, 7 suppliers were sampled for additional verification as part of the audit for the RED scheme.

5.8 Main strengths and weaknesses of the management system and operations

Professional company with knowledgeable staff and consultant. Understand the system and have experience with PEFC and ENplus certification systems. All incoming material is verified under the PEFC DDS, making risk of mixing with uncontrolled material low. Possible weakness is the fact that the details of the PEFC DDS itself are not part of the audit.

Feedstock can be classified upon receipt. In addition, a supplier evaluation is conducted by the company in addition to a self-declaration. As part of the SBP audit, 7 suppliers of processing residues and post-consumer materials were audited remotely.

5.11 Summary of evaluation activities for chain of custody system per Standard 4

All the management systems and transactions have been inspected. The system in place ensures traceability and integrity of SBP-compliant and SBP-controlled biomass throughout the supply chain. Procedures and records were found to be consistent with the standard's requirements, indicating a high level of compliance and control over material flows and documentation.

Transactions are managed in DTS in conformance with the standard.
